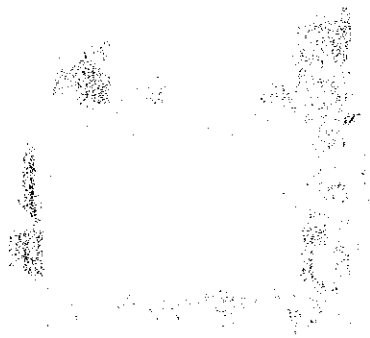

Now for a **REPORT OF THE EVENTS OF ANZAC DAY 2001**

Firstly the photo on the front of this is of last year's march, not a bad looking bunch of veterans!

We were lucky that there was no rain for the march considering the very wet lead up experienced in Melbourne – perhaps that was the reason our numbers were down from 27-23.

You will recognise that our leaders were once again Dr. Mick Dunn and Dr. Alec Reith – the banner again carried by Justin and Brad Murphy. Len Martin, Bob King and Wattie Tully completed the march by motor vehicle.

Other marchers were Jack Bacon, Arthur Bachelor, Rod Boundy, Dick Holmes, Doc Holiday, Ron Handley, Dr. Ross Hayter, David James, Bert Kenny, Dr. John Lawrence, Don Ludlam, Roy Martin, Doug Potter, Alan Sharp, Dr. Murray Verso, Ken Trafford, Ted Young, Ron Woff.

To complete the statistics – we set off at 9:47 am (9:52 last year), reaching the saluting base at 10:18 am (10:25 last year) i.e. 31 minutes as against 33 minutes the previous year.

THE REUNION

President Mick opened proceedings at 11:50am, calling on Dr. Alec Reith to propose the loyal toast.

There were 75 members and family members present – two more than last year, and included Ron and Eileen Handley from N.S.W.

The traditional 2 minutes silence was observed followed by the reading of the names of our growing number deceased members by secretary Dick Holmes and assistant secretary Ken Stanley. President Mick then recited the ode “THEY SHALL GROW NOT OLD..... LEST WE FORGET”. This solemn time in our reunion was concluded by the playing of the Last Post and then reveille.

APPOLOGIES Were received from Ivan Goldsmith, Cliff Watkins, Jules Collard, Sylvia Strudwick, Les Atkins, Pam and Errol Carter, Dr. Colin Copland, Ken Gordon, Dr. Alf Barnett, Merv Blow, Laurie Malkin, Russell Thompson, Stuart Smith and Heather McKenzie.

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING Were taken as read, because they had been adequately covered in tit – bits.

TREASURERS REPORT

Vern Laidlaw presented his report showing a healthy balance as at 18-April-2001 of \$4557.04. He commented on various items particularly that the cost of the luncheon had been subsidised by \$5 per head by the association.

The report was received subject to audit.

Vern also reported the continuing fall in financial membership as follows 1996-96, 1997-74, 1998-59, 1999-66, 2000-65.

10th TIT BITS Ron Woff commented that this was his 26th edition; and that family had once more come to the rescue with the typing and printing – however we may one day have to pay to have this done.

After a very enjoyable lunch Bob Crawford was called on to propose the **TOAST TO THE UNIT.**

Bob recalled many incidents in his Army life including the following. His first camp was at Mornington under ‘Bull’ Martin who had great difficulty in riding a horse. Members travelled to Mornington by train.

His second camp was at Trawool under Dr. Manson who was later killed when the Japanese sank the hospital ship Centaur off Queensland on May 14th 1943.

Bob next recalled the Nagambie road camp and a private Carter who regularly abused the cooks – however they had the last laugh when he some how fell into the grease trap!

Numerous marches over to the Melbourne/Sydney railway line had their bright side as members became adept at catching rabbits, which were brought back for stew.

He recalled the ‘performances’ of ‘our greatest actor’ Bruce Rimmington who failed to fool Lt. Col. “Mac”.

Then after further training in Queensland the trip to Port Morseby and then assisting at 2/9th AGH, our first experience of attending to battle casualties.

With the actions of Buna, Sanananda etc. behind us Bob recalled Oro Bay when some of our Christmas parcels were damaged in an air raid at the wharf – and near misses to some personnel.

Further recollections included sea ambulance transport, and the rivers of Lae. Lastly he paid tribute to our Doctors, particularly Dr. Emmet Spring and the nursing orderlies who did such a good job nursing Scrub Typhus patients.

In talking of our times in Queensland Bob modestly failed to mention his great table tennis victory over John Bromwich. He concluded as follows “Mr President, Ladies and Gentlemen please drink a toast to the 10th Field Ambulance – the BEST in the Army”.

RESPONSE BY THE PRESIDENT

Mick thanked Bob for his toast to the best Field Ambulance. He also thanked the ladies for joining us commenting that “they add tone to the reunion”. He mentioned how luck played a part in our Army life – bad luck for Jack Pigram who was killed when he stood on a mine – good luck in some close calls at Dreger Harbour and in Balikpapan when a main dressing station was being set up where a Jap gun emplacement had been and our bombs just missed.

Finally, today’s luck – no rain after 3 days of heavy rain.

PRESENTATIONS OF LIFE MEMBERSHIP TO DICK HOLMES

President Mick spoke of the 14 years of excellent service by our secretary Dick which led the committee to request members to confer life membership on him. A small gift was presented to him and a magnificent sheath of flowers to his wife Margaret who has been a great support to him.

Dick responded along these lines:

Mr. President, my fellow Committeemen, unit members. I just want to express my appreciation of receiving such an honour. Fourteen years ago my name was proposed as secretary but I didn't for a moment imagine that I would have had the pleasure of serving for so long. The very fact of being in the 10th in itself is a great honour.

In 1942 I was called up along with thousands of others and went to Boys Town in Nagambie Road, Seymour. Shortly after I was drafted into 52 battalion and sent to Wattle Vale near Nagambie. This greatly disappointed me as I was keen to join the 10th.

Fortunately I knew Sgt. Jack Urquhart who approached Lt. Col. McKenzie who put in a claim for me. Within days I was in the 10th and so began my army experience which I look back on with the utmost pride.

Today gives me the wonderful opportunity of saying thank you to you Mr President and all my friends here who I hold in the utmost esteem.

Dear Dick, First of all I wish to apologise for not answering your previous letters. I was very pleased to receive your report on Anzac Day and reading the history of the 10th Field Ambulance by your historian Les Williams I felt very humble. My association with the 10th Field Ambulance was for a very small service, I attended a three month camp at Nagambie Road, Seymour in 1941. I think it was only the second time that this camp was used. Don't I remember those cold showers. We attended another 3 month camp early in 1942. Conditions were much better, with hot showers etc. I was transferred to the hospital to be trained as a nursing orderly. It was very interesting work gaining experience in hospitals at Seymour and Puckapunyal in surgery, infections, and general nursing. We were then notified that we were going into Camp early in July for the duration of the war. I got married in the last Saturday in June and when I arrived home on the Monday ready to go onto camp for the duration on the Tuesday, there was a telegram waiting for me telling me not to go to camp but come to work. What happened was the manpower wanted their printing done (I was a letterpress Machinist with the Government Printing Office) and the Government Printer told them they could not get their work as the army was taking a number of Letterpress Machinists he requested the release of a number of employees. I see in your history a Colonel McKenzie was mentioned. I was just wondering if he was the Major McKenzie who was in charge of the 10th Field Ambulance at Nagambie Road. He was known as the Mad Major when I was at Nagambie Road. Personally I thought he was quite a nice fellow. He taught me a lot during our hospital rounds. For old time sake I would be interested in purchasing a copy of the history if you get around to publishing it. Wishing your organisation every success. Yours faithfully Jack Gilbert.

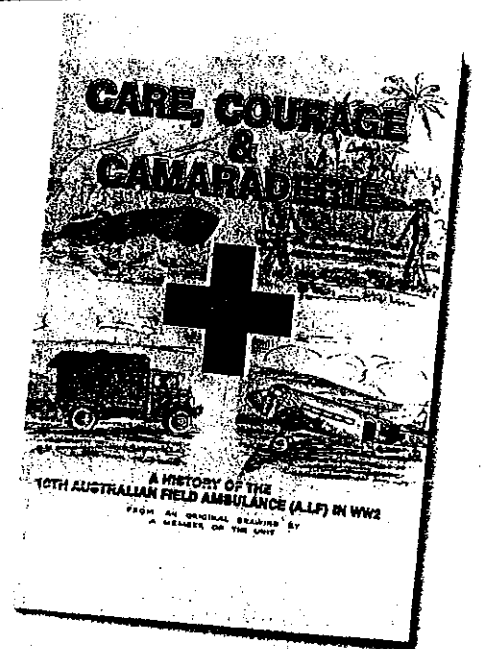
Care, courage & camaraderie
A history of the 10th Australian Field Ambulance

Edited by Leslie Williams, 10th Field Ambulance Association, available from R.O. Holmes, 58 Belgravia Ave, Box Hill North, VIC, 3129

Fifty-seven years after the hideous battle at Sanananda, Captain Colin Copeland visited the Memorial's Second World War Gallery and saw a photograph of himself treating wounded in the swamps of Papua. Leslie Williams's book documents in detail the history of a field ambulance in the south-west Pacific, describing with clarity and compassion the surgical

consequences of that battle and later campaigns in New Guinea and Balikpapan and, in the aftermath of war, on Ambon. *Care, courage & camaraderie* is a model of a unit's history, adding much to our understanding of the experiences of men such as Colin Copeland.
