Lunch

Lunch was taken at 1:10pm till 2:00pm

10th Tit Bits

4. Letter from Elizabeth Brand notifying us that Dr Bill Brands widow, Margaret, had recently passed away.
5. As mentioned in 10th Tit Bits, a letter was sent by the Secretary, that Justin and Bradley Murphy also Thomas McGrath (Krugers' 3 grandsons) be custodians of our banner which they are

honoured to be.

6. Letter was received from the RSL seeking volunteers to help the elderly at Darley House.

The Secretary reported that September 11 had delayed proceedings a little but hopefully the project will proceed shortly.

Toast To The Unit

President Mick called on David James to propose the toast. He thanked his "cobbers" of the unit and friends for this privilege, a unit made up of all different sections of the community. How did I come to join this unit? After spending a few weeks in a "Boys Town" battalion at Seymour I answered a call for volunteers for field ambulance along with a dozen other conscripts. They were lined up to be inspected by an officer carrying a swagger stick. He stopped in front of me and asked why I was still wearing shoes and I replied the 'Q' store did not have a size large enough for me. He then asked why did I want to join a field ambulance unit? My reply was that I was in the Caulfield division-of St Johns ambulance and that was sufficient reason for Lt Col Stan McKenzie to have me in the 10th. I was glad to see that Noel Norton (from the same service) was also in the 10th. My first tent leader was "Pop Cook" who was always interested in his tent mates. A few weeks later Ken Gordon asked did any of the "new boys" have a driving licence - I did and so was transferred into the transport section. During our training in Queensland I was assigned as driver to the C.O. I met many interesting personalities both within and without the unit. I remember driving Q.M. Les Wilton before departing Australia and asked if he had my size boots available? His reply was "yes driver we do" - famous last words!! When the unit arrived in Port Moresby there were no vehicles so the transport boys did general duties. I did nursing duties with the 2/9th AGH for some months, as did some of you. He concluded with this great story:

"At our evacuation post at Nadzab the pair of boots in which I landed in New Guinea finally wore out. Each sole developed a hole so were worn out but had worn well. The message came back from our Q.M. apologising that I must put up with them as my size was well out of stock. A few days after this I observed a small single engine plane land on the Nadzab strip and taxi towards our post. On stopping I heard an American voice call out enquiring where to find a "driver called James" - that is me I called out at which time a pair of boots was thrown out. The aircraft taxied down the strip and took off. Wearable footwear at last!"

Mr President, Ladies and Gentlemen - The 10th Field Ambulance in all its operational activities proved a unit of outstanding capabilities. Please drink a toast to the 10th Field Ambulance.
