Toast To The Unit - Dick Holmes

In the toast, Dick led our memories back to the cultural shock and rigours of Boys Town, Seymour, to Queensland and elements of the Papua New Guinea campaigns in which the unit served. In order not to lose the impact of Dick's descriptive word pictures the transcript of his toast in appended in full. The meeting acclaimed President Mick's expressions of appreciation.

In the early days we used enamel plates prior to the issue of army design mess tins. The mess huts had long trestle tables and the plates were passed along to the end where a person detailed for the jobs served the food. Occasionally we would have sago pudding, which was always so tacky that the plate could be passed along upside down! The sago refused to drop off!!

Our campsite in Nagambie Rd had three areas i.e. Headquarters, "A" company to the north and known as Toorak and "B" company to the south and known as Ferntree Gully.

The toilet block - known as latrines was located at Toorak and had multiple seats and was enclosed with vertical sheets of corrugated iron. One day Ted Monot had an urgent call to go to the latrines, but all seats were occupied. In desperation he picked up some rocks and belted them at the iron walls nearly causing a stampede! He got a seat!

My sister Meg who was in the A.W.A.S was stationed at Advanced Army H.Q in Brisbane. In October 42 she was a sergeant and was working with various senior officers. At this stage we were at Landsborough in readiness for our departure for P.N.G. Meg knew of our movements and asked Colonel Steele if he could arrange for me to go to Brisbane. A signal was received by Major Gavin Johnson instructing him to give me leave, which I had on the 8th of October. I went by train and arrived at A.A.H.Q where I met generals and colonels. Col. Steele gave me advice about the tropics and to "take a tin of powder".

A few days later we were instructed to hand in our surplus blankets. Captain Les Wilton was supervising. When my turn came to throw my blanket into the truck he said "how did you get leave to go to Brisbane?" When I said my sister Meg organised it, he said "did she go to Canterbury State School?" When I said "Yes" he said "would you like to see her again?" He told me to get into the truck and I was soon covered with blankets and so he smuggled me out of camp! When out of sight he asked the driver to stop and I got in front. We unloaded the blankets at an army stores depot, then turned up at A.A.H.Q for a second reunion with Meg!

I have mentioned my little hammer before, but for those who haven't heard about it, briefly, I purchased it in Maryborough, QLD, shortly before we embarked for P.N.G. Amazingly that hammer completely changed my role in the army. After hacking our way through dense jungle at Buna we made a clearing, perfectly concealed from the Japanese and erected various tents one of which was for the theatre. Somehow Major Jim Yates found out that I had a hammer and nails and asked if I could make some tables for instruments etc. for the operating theatre. He left the site for about two hours and came back to find we were ready to commence operating. I had acquired some wooden boxes from the cook and converted them into tables, covered them with white towels and had sterilizing in progress. He was so pleased that he asked me if I would like to join the surgical team. With very little nursing experience, I was very soon involved in giving anaesthetics - i.e. ethyl chloride plastering broken or fractured limbs, and general assistance to the surgical team and within half to one mile from the fighting. As the Australian and American forces progressed it became necessary to establish an advanced surgical post. Here at night, the Japanese penetrated our site. Harold Hay on sentry duty hit Pop Cook on the head with his rifle butt, because Pop didn't state the pass word. After 21 days our team had

Bits & Pieces

Ted Young's Speech at Seymour.

I'd like to welcome you all to this historic occasion and in particular thank the following people - Councilor Sue Marstaeller Mayor of Mitchell shire, Lt. Col. the Rev Peter Hayes, W.O. Joe Linford who organized and placed these rocks and plaques on site, our own secretary Dick Holmes and Vern Laidlaw who did all the slogging work to get this project going, Annie Bright for her support from Mitchell Shire and Jim and Trish Nillson custodians of plaques.

This campsite was established in January 1941 but I want to focus on December 7th 1941 when the Japs bombed Pearl Harbour. This lead to 18 year olds being called up. Some 5000 trained here, the training camp was known as "Boystown" After 6 weeks basic training the 10th FLD AMB was brought up to full strength from some of those 18 year olds. This site was known as campsite no2 — We arrived from Boystown to tents with floor boards and slit trenches dug beside them — 6 men to a tent instead of 8 on bare ground. Col. Stan McKenzie was in charge he reminded us quite often while waving his walking stick around that the Japs were just beyond the gravel pits and as we were going to 'X marks the spot' we had better get used to blood and guts — our unit distinguished itself in a number of campaigns in the NewGuinea namely Buna, Gona and Sanananda at the foothill of the Kakoda track.

In the swamp and jungle – we served at Lae – Finschafen took part in the first sea ambulance evacuation of wounded along the coast between Finschafen and Lae. – in a later compaign some of our unit landed on the beach the first day of the last landing of the war at Balikpapan Borneo. The rest of the unit landed 2nd day. In 6 weeks the war ended. We then helped evacuate our Australian prisoners of the war from the Japanese 'hell hole' in Ambon. This is a thumbnail sketch of our war activities and it all started from this campsite which is why we are here today – It is my pleasure now to introduce the Mayor of Mitchell Shire Cr Sue Marstaeller.

Cr Sue Marstaeller, Mayor - extract from local paper-

"It was a beautiful autumn morning on Wednesday 12th May when I had the honour of unveiling a plaque dedicated to the 10th Australian Field Ambulance (2nd AIF). The old campsite on the Seymour-Nagambie Road was the destination of a busload of WW2 'diggers' who came up from Melbourne to relive old memories of their training days. They witnessed the formal dedication of the plaques commemorating the unit and the memory of those members who died whilst on active service in Papua New Guinea, Borneo and the Hospital Ship "Centaur". A barbrque lunch was provided by the Puckapunyal Army Base, tank museum staff, which capped off a wonderful but emotional day for a wonderful group of veterans".

Future of our Assosiation

We seem to be rather rapidly reaching a milestone in the way our assosiation can be run. The present office bearers are, from time to time, finding it difficult to carry on effectively and it seems sensible to have a "back-up" team in existence to take over. This team should come mainly from our affiliated members.
