

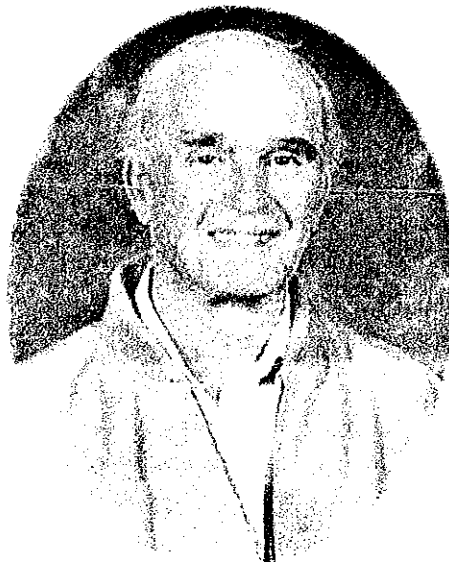


## 10<sup>th</sup> Australian Field Ambulance (A.I.F.)

**BITS AND PIECES**

**Dr Mick Dunn 30<sup>th</sup> May 1912 – 17<sup>th</sup> June 2007**

Tribute by Ted Young at Mick' funeral.

I want to tell you something of the activities of the 10<sup>th</sup> Field Ambulance of which Mick Dunn was

a part. Our Unit distinguished itself in a number of campaigns on the island, namely Buna, Gona and Sanananda at the foothills of the Kakoda track in the swamps and jungles. We served at Lae Finschafen, Dreger Harbour.

Took part in the first Sea Ambulance evacuations of wounded along the coast at night between Finschafen and Lae – some of our unit landed on the beach which was the first day of the last landing of the war at Balikpapan, Borneo. The rest landed the second day, 1<sup>st</sup> July 1945. six weeks later, the war ended. This is a thumbnail sketch of our war activities:

Captain Mick Dunn came to our Unit in 1943, I first met him at Dreger Harbour where we had an evacuation post of sick and wounded. Mick was Officer in Charge. He was like a father figure to us 19 year olds at the time. Our unit was like that of a family, living and working together and looking out for each other and has continued through the years. We spent 18 months in New Guinea and came home in May 1944 for leave. The next time I saw Mick was at a staging camp after our leave – I was not one to salute in those days, me bring a PBP and Mick an Officer I was supposed to salute – if you don't know what a PBP is, then I'll tell you... it's a Poor Bloody Private. And in those days I was a redhead with a nickname of Bluey. Mick was one of those good Officers who never worried about such things as salutes and neither did I. We were pleased to see a friendly face and his first words were "Hello Bluey, did you enjoy your leave? And I hope you found your family well." You see, Mick was a person interested in people not Private Young, but Bluey. He called each of his men by their first name or names which they were known by in the company of their mates.

We were camped at Wongabel on the Artherton Table Lands, Queensland for some months and in August 1944 Captain Dunn was promoted to Major Dunn – Our Unit again went overseas and took part in the last landing of the war, 1<sup>st</sup> July 1945. Our Unit landed on the beach at Balikpapan, Borneo and it is recorded that Major Dunn, the RSM, and a number of other ranks (we were known officially as other ranks) set up a hospital just off the beach for the wounded. We were on Balikpapan for six weeks when the war ended. Our unit went onto Ambon to evacuate Australian Prisoners of War from the Japanese. Mick left the Unit at that time. After discharge a number of our members, having been together and everything we had been through for 4 to 5 years, formed an association to have a reunion and march each year on ANZAC Day. That was 1946. Colonel Stan McKenzie was our President 'til the mid 1950's until his health failed and at the Federal Hotel about 1954 Doctor Mick Dunn who had been a regular attendant at all our reunions was elected unopposed as President of our 10<sup>th</sup> Field Ambulance Association.

I was elected Vice President on the same day and we have held those same positions to this present day – on that day I asked the question as we sat together, he chairing the meeting and me the off-sider said "what do I call you, Dr., Major, Mr President," Mick replied "What my friends call me. Mick, that's all" so we became good friends. Such was the man- and our friendship has lasted over the years.

In early days after the war Ron Woff, Alan Sharp, Mick and myself had many a pleasant round of golf together – Mick myself v. Ron and Alan.

I well remember our 10<sup>th</sup> Field Ambulance Assn 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary held at the Hawthorn Club, President Mick cutting our anniversary cake with a Japanese Samurai sword and it was recorded that no one was injured, the only casualty was the cake.

Back some five years ago, Mick celebrated his 90<sup>th</sup> Birthday. Our 10<sup>th</sup> Fld Amb Committee and wives thought we could not let it pass so we invited Mick and Jill to lunch at the Hotel Sheraton on Southbank – it was a day to remember.

When Mick had his stroke and was moved to the nursing home, Vern Laidlaw and myself went to visit him; we asked at the desk if we could visit Dr Mick Dunn. "All the doctors have gone" they

said. "No this doctor is a patient here!" "We have no one by that name here, but we do have a Douglas Dunn" "Can we see him please" we asked. And of course that was our man. Our visits were beneficial to both Mick and us to re-learn how to communicate with each other because Mick had lost the power to speak.

Roger and Jill were good enough to bring Mick to our reunion lunch on ANZAC Day this year. As he walked into the room aided by his walking frame, he received a standing ovation by all the members, wives and affiliates. Such was his standing with our association as our President. Mick enjoyed himself meeting old friends again – we enjoyed each others' company on that day. Mick will always be remembered with fond memories by all his army mates.
