TOAST TO THE UNIT - 25th April 2012 ANZAC DAY

Last year I foolishly said to Ron Woff at our committee meeting if you propose the toast to the unit this year I will do next year thinking Ron won't remember next year he is 1 year older than me and his memory must be going – but he must have written it down somewhere because he reminded me this year of what I had said so here goes – December 1941 saw 18 year olds called up for military service because Japan had bombed Pearl Harbour and was heading for Australia some 5000 of us went to Seymour and set up camp which was known as Boystown in the paddocks around where Jim and Trish Nilsson live and which they operate their farm. Some years ago we took a bus to Seymour and dedicated a plaque on a rock outside the gate which we all walked through to train. After 6 weeks of basic training some 20 or so came to the 10th Field Ambulance. I was one of them from the 8 in our tent in Boystown I was the only one to come to the 10th. So I asked to be paraded to the C.O. Col Stan McKenzie. I told him I wanted to be with my mates who went to the infantry he looked at me and said lad you are mine and you are going to be mine dismissed. I told this story once before and said the old Col must have seen my potential and I can see Vern Laidlaw saying "you cheeky lad"

The old Col was much wiser than a cheeky 18 year old. We arrived at the 10th Field Ambulance to bring them up to full strength this site was known as camp site no2. We arrived from BoysTown to tents with floor boards and slit trenches' dug beside them 6 to a tent instead of 8 on bare ground. Col McKenzie reminded us on many occasions while waving his walking stick around that the Japs were just beyond the gravel pits that were across the road. We left on foot to march to Bonegilla which took 10 days which and we had more waving of the walking stick as we were going, telling us that X marks the spot where we were heading and we had better get used to blood and guts. While he did not come away with us because of ill health he was a wise old bird and taught us well and our unit distinguished itself in a

number of campaigns on the islands. Namely first at Buna Gona and Sanananda at the foothills of the Kokoda track in the swamps and the jungle. We served at Oro Bay – then Lae and Finschafin. We took part in the first Sea Ambulance transport to bring the wounded along the coast in barges at night from Finschafin and Lae. I remember flying back to Finschafin from Lae in an over loaded Douglas DC3. Taking two attempts to take off then flying through the mountain canyons – with inches to spare on both sides because they could not climb high enough to go over the mountains. On another occasion hitching a ride on a P.T. boat going to Lae the yanks showed us over the boat it was all one big engine with 4 Torpedoes 2 each side and a 50 calibre machine gun at the front and boy could it travel it was dangerous to stand up without hanging on to something as it was going so fast and in no time at all we were back at Finschafin. We came home on leave after some 18 months in New Guinea then went to the Atherton table lands up from Cairns for some months playing all type of sport including two up to keep fit it was a good time at Wongabell. Many years later Esma and I went to Atherton tablelands but could not find our old camp site. We saw many other sites with signs on them but not ours. We were sent to Moratai and on the 1st July 1945 the 7th Division landed on Balikpapan Borneo our B Company landed with them and setup a Hospital on the beach A Company were split up and some went forward with 2/6 commando unit the rest went inland and took over a building and turned it into a Hospital for sick and wounded - 6 weeks later the war finished and we were sent to Ambon. We helped to evacuate our Australian prisoners of war from the hell hole that the Japanese had in Ambon. This is a thumbnail sketch of our war time activities and it all started from the paddocks on Jim and Trish's farm. We are proud of our part that we did in War time and I hope you young people will remember us when we are no longer here. Will you please stand charge your glasses and drink a toast to the 10th Field Ambulance. And now remain standing for another toast - Peter De Jarlais is the son of Roy De Jarlaes a deceased unit member and he is an affiliate member and Veteran of the Vietnam war and has asked if we could toast his unit members as they will toast our unit today, so we toast the 2 Training Battalion D Coy 16th Platoon 2nd intake. 1970-102 Field Battery 12 Field Regiment 8 Medium Regiment – a toast to the Vietnam Veterans unit.

Memories from Jack Allen

I left the 10th Field Ambulance at Oro Bay, being flown from Dobadura by Bully Beef Bomber to 2/9th. A.G.H. at Port Moresby, and after a spell there was transported by Hospital Ship "Mununda" and hospital train to R.G.H. Heidelberg, where after some months was discharged to a Convalescent Camp at Ballarat, where we were supposed to do P.T. to assist in our complete recovery. This was virtually impossible for most of the 'inmates', as for instance one occupant of the tent I was in had only one foot. The highlight of the day was a visit to a nearby pub, the "Bunch of Grapes". You did not need a leave pass, but had to put your name in a book in the orderly room at 4.00pm and was supposed to return by 6 for evening mess. It was the era of 6 o'clock closing then and the publican duly closed the front door at 6, leaving anyone who so desired to stay for as long as they liked. I did stay on after 6 on one occasion as I had met a fellow 'inmate' who had been in the next bed to me at 2/9 AGH Port Moresby and whom I had thought I would not see alive again, and he thought the same about me. So we had

a bit of a celebration. Apparently most of the fellows stayed on for some hours, and the publican would come over to the camp next morning and bring all the crutches and sticks back in his car.

A Poem – Remembrance

There is a tree I know, a lovely thing... I see it only when I close my eyes. No tight-lipped buds embroider it in Spring. No glowing russet mantle ever lies about its shapely shoulders in this fall, and in the chilling air of winters breath when short-lived days pass swiftly into night, it never tokens grief, or speaks of death.

Nay, it is always summer in my tree... Splendid it stands in fullest leaf and flower. And to its peace—filled canopy I haste as would a lover to his lady's bower.

My tree is called "Remembrance"- gracious name, sweet to the ears of those who understand, who lean far out into the dark of time and feel the pressure of a dear, lost hand -.

Here in the quiet of his holy day I vow mine is the everlasting tree, whose leaves are for the healing of all hearts, the ease of pain, the drying of all tears that flow from out the founts of memory.

Come, sorrowing ones; come, close your eyes with me and together let us kneel beneath my tree.
