

Toast To The Unit ANZAC Day 2014

ladies and gentlemen my father Jack Allen lives in Ararat, and is unwell at the moment, making the journey down is not possible he has asked me to give the toast on his behalf.

I'am not good at making speeches, forgive me if I ad-lib a little, recently dad and I sat down and wrote a few notes on what he wanted to say today.

dad (jack) was part of the transport section of the 10th he drove the water truck for awhile and was responsible for finding clean water. he recalls a time when he and Lloyd Stuart found a steam kitchen in Caloundra (Queensland) (the town had been evacuated)they "pinched" it and it turned out to be very useful for pumping water out of the rivers.

another story he told me was about one of the men, who shall remain nameless, who was often trying to get out of marching, according to him all you had to do was say you were sick and you didn't have to march, the officers decided to clamp down on this. The next time he tried to get out of marching the M.O. said "what's wrong with you soldier?" "I've got a headache sir" said the soldier. The MO's reply—"yes so have I now piss off!!"

Later when the 10th was sent to New Guinea Dad tells of how he has treasured the integrity and the compassion of the men of the 10th. He recalled how at Milne bay the unit was supposed to get rest and recreation leave but the leave was cancelled and instead they were required to set-up a hospital on the top of a ridge. Milne bay was a terrible sight the harbour was full sunken boats and debris, but the men just went about setting up the hospital and got on with it all.

Jack (dad) is avid reader, but rarely reads books about the war. He did however read the book "a bastard of a place" and commented that it was an accurate account of the place, and he confirmed it as his experience. It was indeed a bastard of a place!

Jack's war "ended" (if it ever does) at Oro bay, where he became extremely ill with malaria, and was flown down to Port Moresby and later a hospital ship and the journey back to Melbourne for repatriation.

Jack has always been proud to be part of the $10^{\rm th}$ field ambulance association, and has over the years tried to attend as many reunions as possible.

Jack wanted to finish by saying - we are all caretakers of the Australian diggers' legend, we don't glorify it, we simply remember and go on preserving the memories.

Sections from the Campsie RSL Sub-Branch (NSW) - ANZAC DAY commemoration service 2014: Introduction – ANZAC Day marks the anniversary of the first campaign that led to major casualties for Australian and New Zealand forces during the First World War. The acronym ANZAC stands for Australian and New Zealand Army Corps, whose soldiers were known as ANZACS. ANZAC Day remains one of the most important national occasions of both Australia and New Zealand. In 1915, Australian and New Zealand soldiers formed part of an allied expedition that set out to capture the Gallipoli Peninsula, according to a plan by Winston Churchill to open the way to the Black Sea for the Allied navies. The ANZAC force landed at Gallipoli on 25th April, meeting fierce resistance from the Ottoman Army. What had been planned as a bold strike to knock the Ottoman's out of the war quickly became a stalemate and the campaign dragged on for eight months.

The date 25 April was officially named ANZAC Day in 1916. In that year it was marked by a wide variety of ceremonies and services in Australia and New Zealand including a commemorative march through London involving Australian and New Zealand troops.

BITS & PIECES

David Hall provided us with a five page edition on Stretcher Bearers in WW1+2 written by Mark Johnston and we have taken the following extracts from this.

From a rocky start, Australian stretcher - Bearers were soon considered some of the bravest and most respected men in the country's fighting forces. By Mark Johnston

Australian Army stretcher-bearers made hundreds of thousands "carriers" in the two world wars. The cry of "stretcher-bearers!" was heard on every Australian front, and whenever it was heard Australian bearers responded.

During World War 1-

Their main tasks was to go to casualties on the field, render first aid to those unable to walk, and carry them on stretchers to the Regimental Aid Post (RAP). That post, the battalion's medical facility, was commanded by a Regimental Medical Officer (RMO).

The RMO treated and triage casualties. Some casualties returned to the line, but most of those requiring a stretcher to reach the RAP needed to be carried further back behind the line for more treatment at better-equipped medical stations. Ambulance bearers did this sort of carrying, often using relay posts at intervals of about 400 metres.

On the Kakoda Track and elsewhere in New Guinea there are carries recorded of up to 12 hours. Bearers not only carried but also treated casualties. It was the RSB's job to halt serious haemorrhage, employ splints where necessary, and apply dressings - known as "shell dressings" - to protect the wound. RSBs had tourniquets and, in the Second World War, morphine.

Another catergory of men was compelled to work as stretcher-bearers for the Australian Army: namely indigenous men of Papua New Guinea conscripted by the Australian government. They were not consulted about their attitude to war, but worked as bearers with remarkable efficiency and compassion. By war's end stretcher-bearers were often singled out by men of all ranks as exemplifying soldierly

virtue. General Monash wrote: "there was no finer example of individual self-sacrifice, for the benefit of comrades, than the Stretcher-bearer service, which suffered exceedingly in its noble work of succouring the wounded, and exposed itself unflinchingly to every danger."

The tradition established by Australian stretcher-bearers, in the world wars was compassionate rather than combative. The ANZAC legacy is arguably as much about the humane as the homicidal. Stretcherbearers, responding immediately to every call for help and then plodding slowly across dangerous ground while talking reassuringly to their maimed and cumbersome patients, worked not only in the service of a great army designed to win wars, but also in the service of humanity.
